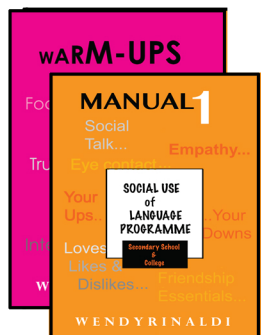
Social Communication: Eye contact, listening (including empathy) conversations, awareness of personal space, rate and volume

When it comes to teaching/therapy, you start with the **MANUAL**. The skills link and so are covered in a particular order to enable learning to build. The manual explains all this, lists all the activities and includes session frameworks. The first sessions are about enabling students to see the big picture - what the whole course is about/ the aims and include fun pictures for group agreements for getting the most from the sessions

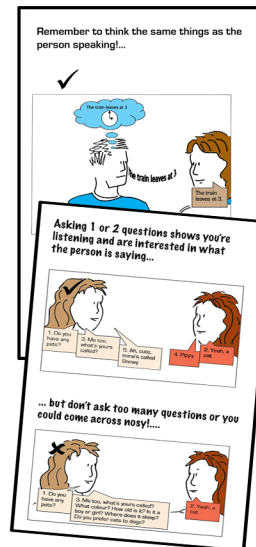

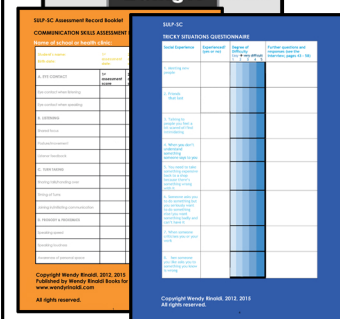
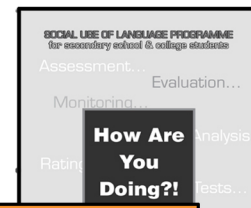

The posters are emailed for you to print according to the licence that is emailed at the time of purchase.

The **ASSESSMENT** gives you a baseline and evaluates effectiveness. It gives you a record of the students' progress on all the skills covered by the teaching/therapy programme that can be shared at a glance. It comprises a handbook with communication skills assessment activities, rating chart, Self-Other Awareness Interview and Tricky Situations Questionnaire, together with record booklets/summary profiles.



HOW TO USE SULP-SC SET 2:

Tricky Social Times: Standing up for yourself without getting mad; When it's hard to say no, Compromise; Who can you trust? When you don't understand; Unfair situations; Put downs, wind-ups & bullies, Handling constructive criticism Ok or not ok? Tuning in to monitor the effects of your behaviour.

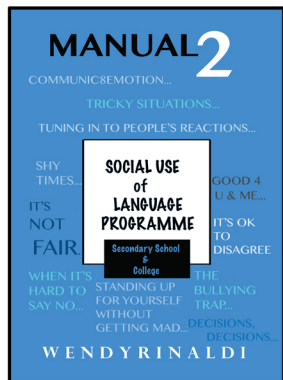
Self-Other Awareness: Other people's perspectives; Opinions (includes handling difference of opinion); Decision making (thinking things through); Emotional Communication; Body Beautiful (personal hygiene and diet)

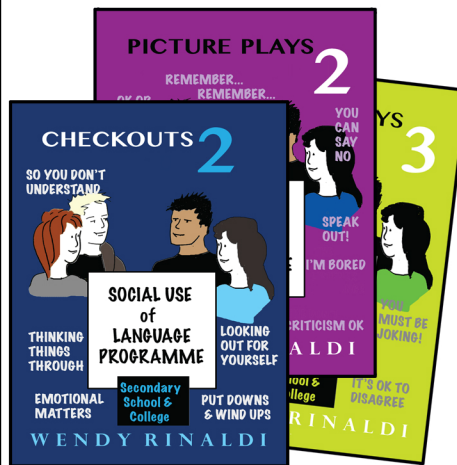

SULP can be used with students who have a wide range of ability but I have additionally included an ebook (screen read only) designed for students with severe learning difficulties that can be used to precede the picture plays (in SULP-SC or SULP adults) or it can be used as a resource in itself. It is a pdf file with around 400 pages and is supplied with a complimentary mini movie.

The text is simple and the pictures enable repetition of the more basic concepts included in the picture plays. The pictures themselves are free of text and you can use the marquee zoom feature on your computer to zoom in on the characters' faces if needed. A few examples are included below – the actual picture size on the file is A4 and you can hook up to any large screen, with the relevant cables, to create very large images or if you are working with larger groups.

Ted and Mia can listen to music together



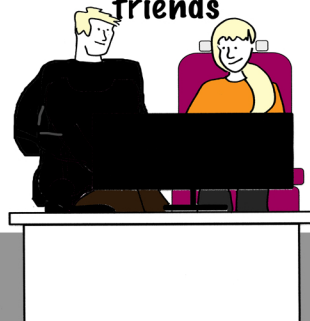
Then Mia and Ted play computer games.

Lisa says : hello Emma

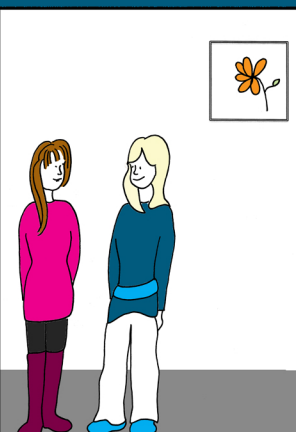
Emma says: Hello Lisa!

Emma and Lisa are having a chat.

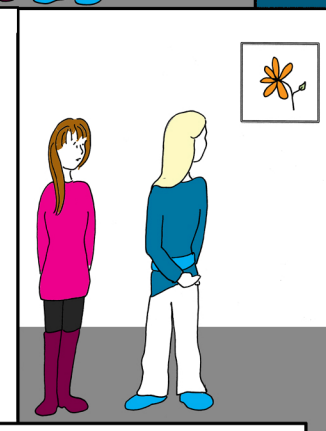
Lisa is looking at Emma (point to Lisa's eyes).
